<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) To increase understanding of the changes in “New” Japanese cinema from the 1980s onwards.</li> <li>2) To analyze the reinvention of Japanese cinema through genres and the affect of globalization.</li> <li>3) To investigate whether Japanese cinema reflects and shapes contemporary Japanese identities.</li> <li>4) To acquire the technical and critical skills to discuss and “read” films in historical and socio-cultural contexts.</li> </ol>			
<b>【Course Summary : 授業の概要】</b>			
<p>Japanese cinema was said to have peaked in the 1950s and 1960s with directors like Akira Kurosawa and Oshima Nagisa, and was thought to have lulled for 20 years thereafter. However, the resurgence of new directors and films in the late 1980s and 1990s once again focused the world’s attention on Japanese cinema. This course is an introduction to contemporary Japanese films from the 1980s to present. By focusing on major directors, themes and genres, students will acquire the fundamentals of critical and technical language necessary to discuss and analyze films. The primary goal of this course is to understand the reinvention and transformation of contemporary Japanese cinema.</p>
