## 【Course Objectives: 授業の到達目標】

After successfully completing this course, students will acquire competence in writing kanji and kanji combination words of first half of intermediate level, and in writing basic academic essays. At the end of the term, students will be asked to write an short academic essay by using what they have learned throughout the course.

### 【Course Summary: 授業の概要】

- 1. Quizzes about the previous lesson's content
- 2. Presentation of the day (one student per class)
- 3. Learning Kanji and Kanji combinations (about 300 Kanji and 900 Kanji combinations)
- 4. Exercises in writing: short academic essay
- \*Kanji, Kanji combinations, weekly items of academic writing/reading and final essays are the same as in Japanese Reading B (V), by the same instructor.

# 【Study Required outside Class (Preparation, etc.): 事前·事後学習】

Students are expected to:

- 1. Prepare for the next lesson's Kanji and Kanji combinations.
- 2. Prepare for the quizzes regarding the previous lesson, by memorizing Kanji and Kanji combinations before every session.
- 3. Write a short academic essay.
- 4. Prepare for their presentations. (Presentations will occur several times per semester. Frequency and subjects will depend on class conditions.)
- 5. Prepare for the Kanji and Kanji combinations' final exam.
- \*A minimum of three hours should be spent on each of these weekly preparations. Students must also prepare for a presentation several times a semester. A minimum of two hours should be spent for the preparation of these presentations. A minimum of five hours should be spent for the preparation for the Kanji and Kanji combinations' final exam. A minimum of three hours should be spent for the completion of the academic essay.
