【Course Objectives: 授業の到達目標】

To develop basic skills of communication in Japanese:

- 1. The ability to listen to and understand everyday conversation.
- 2. The ability to communicate everyday needs in common conversational situations.
- 3. The ability to present your favorite thing, place, or person in front of the class.
- 4. The ability to correctly incorporate Japanese culture and customs into language use.

【Course Summary: 授業の概要】

This course is aimed at those who have completed the first half of introductory Japanese. Through the introduction of basic sentence patterns, vocabulary and common expressions students will learn to speak about themselves and various topics of personal relevance. At the completion of this course students will be able to communicate solely in Japanese in common situations of daily life. This course covers Lesson 7 to Lesson 15 of Genki I and Genki 2. Approximately 55 new sentence structures will be introduced. Topics include shopping, asking for help, making offers, giving or asking for permission, etc. A variety of classroom activities designed to improve communication skills will also be used throughout.

【Study Required outside Class (Preparation etc): 事前·事後学習】

It is essential for students to check both e-mail and the class schedule details and information on the class Moodle daily. Please read the grammar explanations in the textbook and watch the Genki grammar videos before class so you are well prepared. Challenge quiz, a quiz on Moodle to evaluate comprehension, must be completed before each class. Class assignments need to be submitted on Moodle or in class on time.

Late submission or incomplete assignments will result in reduced scores.

Preparing before class and reviewing after class are the keys to success in Japanese classes.
