【Note: 履修上の注意】

•Textbooks and handouts of reading materials are required for each class. Bring them with you.

• If you are late to class more than 3 times it will count as one absence. Students are highly recommended to be seated 3 minutes before the class starts.

• Being more than 15 minutes late will count as one absence.

• Students who have 80% or lower attendance are not allowed to take exams. Exceptions for extended illness will only be made when written medical proof is provided.

•If a student uses their smartphone inappropriately, engages in activities unrelated to the class, or does not participate in class activities, they will be warned the first time. From the second time onward, it will be counted as an absence.

- Each unexcused absence will lower the overall course grade by 1%.
- No make-ups will be given for Kanji quizzes, but the lowest quiz score will be dropped.
- Make-ups will only be given for tests (midterm and final exams). Written medical proof is required.

• If a student cheats in any examinations (including quizzes) or plagiarizes required writing tasks, this student will receive a F as that final subject.

● All submissions, whether in draft or final form, to meet course requirements (including assignments and writing compositions) must be the student's own work. The use of either translation tools or AI tools for course assignments is the same as receiving assistance from another person. This goes against the fundamental requirement that all work must be the student's own and is strictly prohibited.
